DINING

The 2,500-square-foot Panorama restaurant is named after its sweeping views of Forest Park through floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking Art Hill. Panorama is located on Level 2 in the East Building. It is open during Museum hours, including Friday evenings and weekend brunch.

The Cafe is located on Level 1 of the South Building; Panorama Restaurant is off Taylor Hall in the East Building.

THE MUSEUM SHOPS

Located on Level 1 of the South Building and in Taylor Hall in the East Building. Members receive at 10% discount.

RESTROOMS

Women's restrooms are located on Levels 1 & 2 of the Main Building, Levels 1 & 2 of the South Building, and off Taylor Hall in the East Building. Men's restrooms are located on Level 1 of the Main Building, Levels 1 & 2 of the South Building, and off Taylor Hall in the East Building.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Photography and videotaping of the collection is allowed for personal use only. Flash, tripods, monopods, selfie sticks, and all other supportive devices are not permitted. Please note: photos and videos taken of visitors may be used to publicize the Museum.

PROTECTING THE WORKS OF ART

Backpacks must be checked at one of the Museum's two coat check locations, along with food and drink, large bags, umbrellas and any other items that might cause accidental damage. Child carriers must worn in the front or checked at the coat check. Strollers are available free of charge. Anything larger than 11" x 17", including signs, posters, and promotional materials must also be checked at a coat check. Large bags and backpacks also are subject to search.
