Collage Cards and Envelopes

Materials

- Paper of varying sizes, colors, and patterns
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Drawing materials

Instructions

- To create an envelope, use a larger square piece of paper. For one example of how to make your envelope, see a step-by-step process in the video on the Museum's website. For additional ideas, look to envelopes you may have around your home. Glue down any remaining flaps so your envelope is secure.
- To create a card, cut images or designs out of patterned or colored paper. Arrange them on a larger piece of paper that serves as your base. If you are using an envelope, make sure that your card will fit inside your envelope. This piece of paper can be folded or flat. Attach your collage elements to your base using tape or glue.
- Write a message inside or on the back of your card.
- Address your envelope to its recipient and deliver it by mail or in person.
