

Creature Sculptures

Materials

- Toilet paper or paper towel cardboard tubes
- Cardboard boxes, milk cartons, and other recyclable materials
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Paper of any size or color
- Drawing materials such as colored pencils, crayons, or markers



Instructions

- Decide what kind of creature you would like to create. If you want, think about including opposite traits, such as a long neck and short legs or big eyes and a small head.
- Take one of your cardboard tubes or any other material you choose to create the body of your creature, and cover it with paper or add designs with drawing materials.
- Create elements such as arms, legs, tails, and heads by cutting them out of paper or other recyclable materials. Attach them by cutting slits into your body piece and then slipping them in and securing them with tape or glue. They can also simply be secured with tape or glue without making slits in the body.
- Add additional details with drawing materials.
