

Paper Bag Smocks

Materials

- Paper grocery bag
- Additional paper of any size, color, or shape
- Decorations such as aluminum foil, bottle caps, plastic, string, etc.
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Drawing materials such as colored pencils, markers, or crayons



Instructions

- To create a smock from your paper bag, cut along one of the sides of the bag to remove the side panel. Repeat the process on the other side. The front, back, and bottom of the bag should remain.
- Cut a hole in the bottom of the bag that is big enough to slip your head through.
- Think about what kind of garment you would like to create. Use your paper, decorations, and drawing materials to create your garment.
- When you are finished, slip the smock over your head and wear your creation!
